She also provides examples of how ECM providers and lead care managers can serve this population of focus.</p> <p>Additionally, PHC provided an overview of the Justice Involved Initiative and the ECM Benefit, which will offer Medi-Cal services to justice-involved individuals. The initiative will be divided into two parts, with the ECM benefit focusing on individuals transitioning from incarceration and the pre-release services targeting justice-involved individuals while they are incarcerated.
