CalAIM Capital Needs Survey Request

Kaiser Permanente has partnered with the Nonprofit Finance Fund (NFF) to assess working capital challenges facing CBOs delivering housing-related Community Supports under CalAIM.

What is it?

- A 15-20 minute survey conducted in partnership with the Nonprofit Finance Fund (NFF) to assess working capital needs.
- Approximations are fine exact figures are not required.
- Informs potential **financial tools and supports** to strengthen service delivery infrastructure.

Who should complete it?

- Any CBO providing housing-related services under CalAIM.
- Recommended respondents should have some knowledge of organizational finances and CalAIM contracting.

Responses are aggregated; individual data will not be shared.

Kaiser Permanente Medi-Cal will be working with PATH CPI to distribute the NFF survey link.

Please respond by September 30.





REMINDER: Updated Kaiser Permanente Referral Forms

Kaiser Permanente has released new CalAIM referral forms as of July 2025. New referral forms aim to improve successful linkages and enhance information collected, thereby reducing authorization delays.

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- 1. Enhanced Care Management, Complex Care

 Management (CCM), and Community Health Workers

 Referral Form
- Community Supports Referral Form Housing Insecurities
- 3. <u>Community Supports Referral Form Keeping Members</u> at the Home and Chronic Conditions



Submitting Referrals | ECM, CS, and CHW

Kaiser Permanente (KP) has a <u>no-wrong-door</u> approach to referrals.

- Referrals are accepted from any source (members, providers, family, community organizations, etc.)
- Referrals may be placed via email, via phone, or through KP Health Connect.

Managing Your Health Online Anytime

Step 1:

Go to **kp.org/registernow** Click on "Create my account."

Step 2:

Enter your plan information Select your region. Then, enter the medical/health record number printed on your ID card name and birth date.

Step 3:

Accept the terms and conditions

Step 4:

Create your user ID

Choose a user ID and enter your email address. After you're registered, you'll use this ID to sign on to **kp.org**.


Step 5:

Secure your account

Complete the security steps online. After answering a few questions to confirm your identity, you'll create a password and pick 3 secret questions to help keep your account secure.

Kaiser Permanente has flyers on registering a KP.org account. Sign on to kp.org anytime to:

- View most lab test results
- Refill most prescriptions
- Email your doctor's office with nonurgent questions
- Schedule and cancel routine appointments
- Print vaccination records for school, sports, and camp
- Check your plan's benefits, view claims, or estimate costs
- Manage a family member's health care
