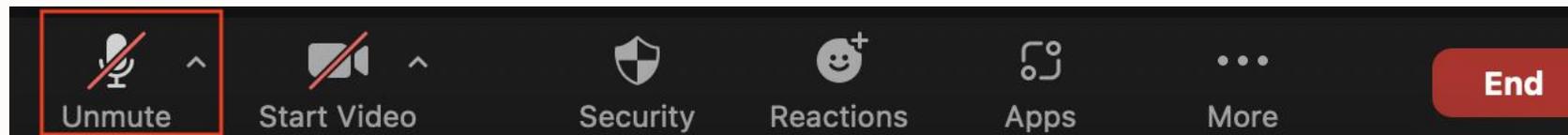

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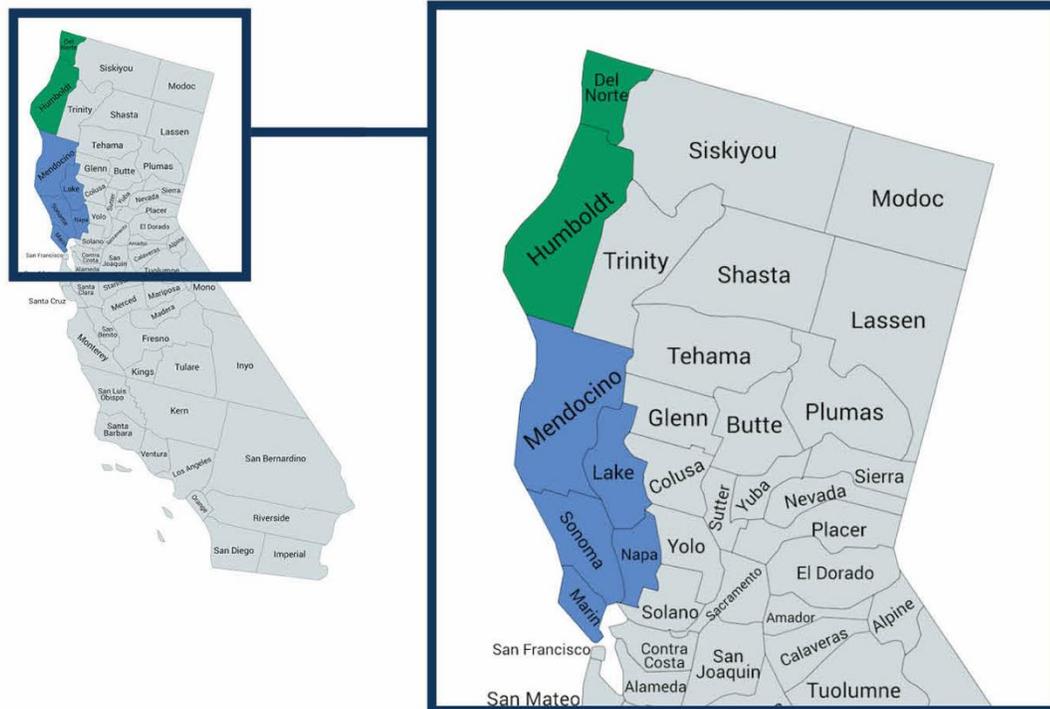

Commitments to Community Inclusivity

Be Present, Brave, and Curious

- Encourage different opinions and respectful disagreement
- Embrace conflict which can deepen our understanding
- **Acknowledge the risk speakers take, and value the privilege to learn from one another**
- Make use of opportunities to connect person-to-person

Create An Inclusive Space

- Invite the unheard voices

Invite Anti-Racist Dialogue





Components of the CalAIM Justice-Involved Initiative

The CalAIM Justice-Involved Initiative support justice-involved individuals by providing key services pre-release, enrolling them in Medi-Cal coverage, and connecting them with behavioral health, social services, and other providers that can support their reentry.

Justice-Involved Initiative Include:




Services delivered in the pre-release period are covered through fee-for-service

Services delivered in the post-release period are covered under managed care

- In the first two weeks after release:
 - 10x higher overdose mortality



The days following release...




- JI initiative is about continuity of case management throughout the reentry process
- Warm handoff and BH linkages prior to release are critical
- Close communication between CFs and Community providers is essential

Multidisciplinary Approach



Central Care Plan that Follows the Person



- **Pre-Release Services:**
 - Comprehensive healthcare and Behavioral healthcare provided during the incarceration. Includes all Medi-Cal covered services plus case management. (like ECM, but not called ECM while still in jail). 90 day limit.
- **In-Reach:**
 - Refers to case management services done during Pre-Release by a provider that will continue to serve as an ECM provider upon release
- **Embedded:**
 - Refers to case management services provided during Pre-Release by a provider who only operates inside the jail; requires a “warm handoff” to an ECM provider 2 weeks before release.

- **Data Sharing:**
 - Template for sharing information on IPs wanting to opt in for ECM is under construction
 - HIPAA guidance paves a path forward for now
- **Billing**
 - JI ECM providers must be enrolled in the PAVE system to bill for services rendered prior to release, per DHCS
- **Access and Warm Handoffs**
 - Warm handoff requirement to take place 2 weeks prior to release
 - Must establish relationship with CFs to support this process.
 - Video conferencing capability is a strong plus

- Liaison: Responsive and Collaborative
- Systems: This is new, it's never been done before
- Patience: See above; we are all learning as we go





PATH Background

California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) is designed to improve the quality of life and health outcomes of Medi-Cal Members by implementing broad delivery system, program, and payment reform across the Medi-Cal program. CalAIM establishes the framework to address social determinants of health and improve health equity statewide. As part of CalAIM, California received targeted expenditure authority for the Providing Access and Transforming Health (PATH) initiative as part of its [section 1115 demonstration renewal](#) to scale whole person approaches to care statewide with a clear equity lens, ensure a strong foundation for integrated, comprehensive care, and a smooth transition from Whole Person Care (WPC) and Health Home pilots that retains investments made by the state, local partners, and the federal government. PATH provides tools and resources to county and community-based providers including public hospitals, county, city and other government agencies, justice agencies, community-based organizations (CBOs), Tribes and Indian Health Care Providers and others to ensure a successful implementation of [Enhanced Care Management \(ECM\) and Community Supports](#).

PATH is comprised of multiple aligned initiatives that will support implementation of ECM and Community Support services in varying ways. The remainder of this document is focused on the PATH-funded [Collaborative Planning and Implementation Initiative](#), described at a high-level below.



Updated Release of Information (ROI) from DHCS

ASCFI Form 2.0 Release

DHCS released the updated Authorization to Share Confidential Member Information (ASCFI) Form. ASCFI 2.0 is a standardized consent form that providers may use to get a person's permission to share specified sensitive information about their physical health, behavioral health, housing, and social services. (2 Versions)

“ASCFI : AB 133” can be used to authorize data sharing for the following individuals:

1. Individuals enrolled in a Medi-Cal managed care plan.
2. Individuals receiving behavioral health services under Medi-Cal.
3. Individuals involved in the criminal legal system that qualify for pre-release Medi-Cal benefits.

“ASCFI : Non-AB 133” can be used to authorize data sharing for individuals who do not meet the criteria in ASCFI : AB 133:

1. Not enrolled in a Medi-Cal managed care plan.
2. Not receiving behavioral health services under Medi-Cal.
3. Not involved in the criminal legal system that qualify for pre-release Medi-Cal benefits.
